

## Dulles Greenway Announces Charity Recipients

**(Dulles, VA, October 2008)** Toll Road Investors Partnership II, L.P. (TRIP II), the owner of the Dulles Greenway concession, announced those local charities that would benefit from their annual Drive For Charity Event. The Annual Drive for Charity is an initiative where one day's tolls are collected and distributed to charitable organizations that provide assistance and services to the Loudoun County community. These charities are involved in children's health, youth welfare, social service and the environment and will receive funding for a three year period, 2009 – 2011 as this provides much needed certainty of funding to the beneficiaries and ensures a meaningful level of donation is achieved.

Those charities to benefit from the Drive For Charity Event are:

**Every Citizen Has Opportunities (ECHO)** - a nonprofit organization organized in 1975 in order to provide vocational training, supported employment, community integration and transportation services for adults with developmental disabilities.

**Fresh Air/Full Care** – provides additional resources needed to place the children of Loudoun's working poor into a safe, secure, nurturing and licensed day care facility and increases the number of children served by Loudoun County's summer camp program for the needy, at-risk children.

**Loudoun Abused Women's Shelter (LAWS)** – an organization, opened in 1985, whose primary objective is to provide crisis intervention, support and advocacy for women and children who are victims of domestic violence, sexual assault and child abuse in Loudoun County.

**Loudoun Wildlife Conservancy** - their mission is the preservation and proliferation of wildlife habitats in Loudoun County. This organization monitors the county's environment by holding annual bird and butterfly surveys, and monitoring the health of the county's streams.

**March of Dimes** – the mission of this organization is to improve the health of babies by preventing birth defects, premature birth and infant mortality. The funds donated by the Dulles Greenway in the past have gone to support the NICU Family Support Program at Inova Fairfax Hospital for Children.
